OPERATIONS ORDER
FROM: GROUP 3 EMERGENCY SERVICE DIVISION
SUBJECT: GROUND TEAM LEVEL 3 TRAINING

1. PURPOSE: This activity will:
 - a. Provide each participant with the information required to complete the SQTR GTM3 task sign-offs.
 - b. To expand the interest in Ground Team Training by 8% of Group 3 *Team Members*.
 - c. Develop a network of trainers to assist Group 3 in the expansion of our role in Ground Team missions by the end of this year.
2. PRE-REQUISITES: Current GES 101 card and B-Cut Communications card.
3. WHEN/WHERE: 18 Aug 2007 thru 19 Aug 2007 located at Lake Park, 17302 N. Dale Mabry Hey. Lutz, FL 33519 (GPS coordinates: N 28 07' 7.95 W82 30' 9.9).
4. WHO: All CAP members of Group 3 and any other FLWG CAP member who is willing (CAP Officers & Cadets). The amount of participants will be limited to the amount of evaluators, so sign p early (first come first served).
5. COST: There is no application or activity cost.
6. APPLICATION PROCEDURES: Submit a FLWG 500 (Cadets) and a CAPF 17 (Adults) address to: (Lt Robert Leviton, 12723 Grand Traverse Dr. Dade City, FL 33525-8247 no later than 30 Jul 07. CAP Officers (senior members) enclose a printout of the completion of CPPT & Level 1 Training from e-services or any proof of completion. Applications received past the due dates will be accepted on a case by case basis.
7. MEALS: Each individual shall pack and prepare their own meals (see attached recommended meal list). Each participant shall bring 2 breakfasts, 2 lunches, 1 dinner, snacks and Gatorade. No sodas, alcohol permitted.. Pack as if you are out in the field for 72 hours.
8. EQUIPMENT/CONTRABAND LIST: See Enclosure 1
9. UNIFORM OF THE DAY: BDU's with FLWG Patch, Reverse Flag and proper CAP nametapes or the Blue CAP Field uniform with proper patches and CAP nametapes for those CAP Officers that don't meet the weight standards.
10. STAFF POSITIONS: No open staff position.
11. TRANSPORTATION: Transportation to and from this activity will be the responsibility of each participant. Arrival/Check-in will be 0800-0900 18 Aug 07 and Departure/Check-out will be 1700 19 Aug 07. All cadets who drive to this event will turn in their vehicle keys at check-in. They will be returned at time of check-out.
12. SCHEDULE: The schedule for this activity will be posted at Group 3 website prior to 1 Aug 07 and is the responsibility of each participant to review. There will be no physical fitness training at this activity and each member will be treated as if they have signed up for a mission.

EQUIPMENT

For this activity all items that are listed in Task O-0001 (Prepare Ground Team Individual Equipment) the 24 hour and 72 hour pack requirements (*each individual will be checked for evaluation*).

GROOMING

Cadets must follow regulations regarding hair color and hair grooming according to CAPM 39-1

Natural hair color for ALL cadets

Males: fresh-cut, AF style haircut

Females: Hair ties (matching hair color) hair gel/spray, and/or clips etc.

Trimmed toenails/nails; nail color – natural or clear polish

MEDICATIONS

All medications (including over-the-counter items) **must be** in the original containers. Pharmacy labeled containers with individual's name, medication name, and dispensing instruction must be on these. Medications should be in a Zip Lock Baggie with Cadet Name and CAD ID written on it. An opportunity will arise for cadets to notify the medical officer of all medication upon arrival.

PROHIBITED ITEMS

Do not bring radios, games, comic books, playing cards, knives (that exceed CAP Regulations), toys, fireworks, electronic games, weapons of any kind, pagers / beepers, alcohol or tobacco products.

Jewelry **will not be worn** and should not be brought to this activity. This includes body-piercing. (Exception: medical information jewelry and items required by your religion. No visible chains.)

Any items on this list or any additional items determined by the staff to be inappropriate for activity use will be secured for the duration of the activity and returned to the CAP member after dismissal from the activity. You should not bring any non-CAP books.
